NUMBER OF HOMELESS PEOPLE

The homeless service providers in Jefferson County, Kentucky, counted 6,373 unduplicated homeless people who were served between October 1, 2015 and September 31, 2016. This represents a 5.4% decrease in the number of homeless people last year over the year prior, including people who were sheltered (who stayed in emergency or transitional shelter) and unsheltered (who lived only in the streets or in camps). As with each year, the count of unsheltered homeless is likely an undercount due to the difficulty in counting these individuals.
