

# THE COALITION FOR THE HOMELESS 2015-16 ANNUAL REPORT



On April Fool's Day 2017, I realized it was my seventh anniversary as the Executive Director of the Coalition for the Homeless. I want to thank each and every one of you for giving me the energy and enthusiasm that has made this possible through your support and personal work to end homelessness in Louisville. Where resources are available, we have made great strides housing 1,100 veterans in two years, reducing chronic homelessness to less than 100, and lowering the overall homeless count by 12.4%. But, while Louisville's homeless population has decreased 30% in five years, some populations like youth and families have seen no decrease.

That is why I am asking you all to join with us this year to work to address young adult homelessness in Louisville. As someone who lost my mother at 15, I know what it is like to try to figure out the world without an adult and as I talk to the youth who are living on the streets and in adult shelters here, they echo the same fears explaining that their greatest need is someone to listen and be there for them.

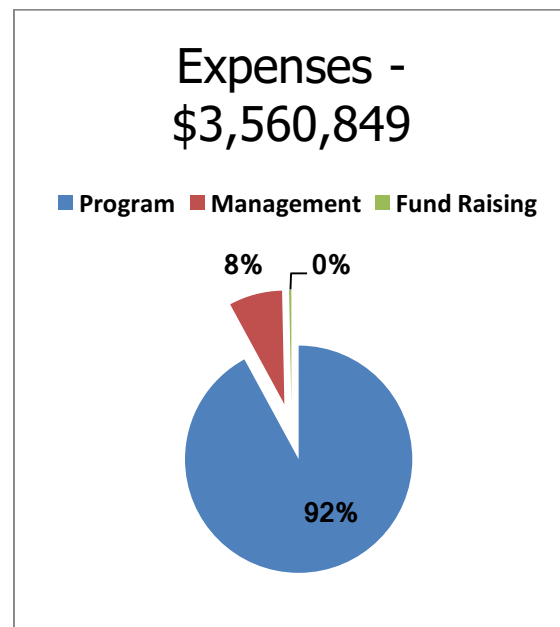
