After years of significant increases, in 2024, the total number of clients who received homeless services in Louisville appears to have stabilized. But unfortunately, due to increased lengths of stays in shelter and difficulty accessing affordable housing, the number of clients moved into permanent housing dropped in 2024 over 2023.
