For two years now, the total number of people who received homeless services in Louisville has remained relatively stable. But in a stark contrast with 2024, the number of clients moved into permanent housing increased by over 15%, for a total of 1,683, due to new permanent supportive housing and affordable housing made available through federal ARP dollars.
